### WJPS Careers Week 2025

We hope you have had a sense from your children of what a busy and exciting week it has been at school. The aim of WJPS Careers Week is to share with everyone some of the many exciting opportunities, interests and learning they may want to explore as they get older.

We have had lots of visitors in to see us and more to follow in the weeks ahead. Can we say a special thank you to all of our parents and friends who came in to speak to classes and who have made such an impression on our children! Here are just a few of the events from Careers Week – apologies to any of our parent visitors not mentioned here - to see more of our visitors look on our website, Weduc and Facebook pages)

Year 3 and 4 met police dog handler, Will, and 4 of his working police dogs. He told us all about each of them and what jobs they do with him. He also showed us some of the equipment he uses to train and work with his dogs.





We welcomed Ian from Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue Service to our whole school assembly. He talked to us about the important role of a fire officer, what the job involves, how to keep ourselves safe and what they need to wear to protect themselves. We even dressed Mr Dinsley up in all of the uniform.

Year 6 attended a workshop with medical students from Newcastle University and learned about the career path you might take to be a doctor. We learned how to use a stethoscope to listen to your heartbeat, how to test for nerve reflexes and all about the position of the organs in the body.





We were delighted to welcome Dr Liz Day who is a Consultant in Paediatric Intensive Care into Year 4. She talked to us about what a 'typical' day looks like for her. She showed us what equipment she uses and told us what to do if we come across someone who is unwell.

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Year 2 had a visit from the dental team at Honour Health. They talked to us about the importance of oral health and how to keep our teeth and gums healthy. We learned the correct method of brushing our teeth and sorted foods into those high and low in sugar. We enjoyed finding out about a career in dentistry.

Year 3 had a visit from an Orthopaedic Surgeon. He showed us different bones from our body and told us about the different ways he helps people. We were surprised at how long some of the operations lasted!





Year 1 had some special visitors come to see us who told us all about their roles as police officers, they even locked us away in the back of the van!

Year 6 and Year 3 were visited by Abigail who is a solicitor. She told us all about when the law is important to us, what skills you need to become a solicitor and gave an example of a real life legal problem for us to think about.





Year 4 got to meet Rachel Hurdman, an engineer who showed us all the amazing projects she had worked on in Northumberland and around the world. She told us all about what skills she needed to do her job and how many different types of engineers there are and all the different things they are able to design and make.

We were very lucky to have a visit from Dr Bajwa, a dermatologist. He told us all about how he became a doctor, what his job involved and what skills he needed. We also got to find out about all the different problems dermatologists can help with and even got to use a special microscope!





Year 1 were visited by a heart surgeon. She told us all about her exciting job and she even brought in some surgeon hats and masks for us to try. We loved asking her questions such as 'why can we feel our heart beat? and 'how can you fix a hole in someone's heart?',

Year 2 had Paediatric Cardiologist and West Jesmond parent, lember, talk to our classes all about her job. She even brought a model heart for us to look at and discuss what our heart does and the importance of having good heart health



Years 1, 3 and 4 were delighted to welcome Kubra into our assembly. She talked to us all about her work as an artist, showed us her little red ideas sketch book that she keeps in her pocket and showed us a picture of one of her inspirational works of art, which has been displayed at Newcastle Castle.
