Children's Mental Health Week & Zones of Regulations at West Jesmond

This year we are embarking on a new framework to support our children as they develop their emotional literacy. As part of Children's Mental Health Week, we will be introducing 'The Zones of Regulation' as a whole school approach. This framework will help to give our children the language and skills to talk about, and



practise, self-regulation. Feelings are complicated. They come in different sizes, intensities, and levels of energy that are unique within our brains and bodies. To make them easier to talk about, think about, and regulate, The Zones of Regulation organises our feelings, states of alertness, and energy levels into four coloured Zones – Blue, Green, Yellow, and Red. The simple, common language and visual structure of The Zones of Regulation helps make the complex skill of regulation more concrete for learners and those who support them. We learn to regulate our Zones to meet our goals and task demands, as well as support our overall well-being.

Why Teach Self-Regulation?

Regulation is something everyone continually works on whether we are aware of it or not. We all encounter trying circumstances that can test our limits. If we can recognize when we are becoming less regulated, we are able to do something about it to manage our feelings and get ourselves to a healthy place. This comes more naturally for some, but for others it is a skill that needs more attention and practice. This is the goal of The Zones of Regulation.

All the Zones are Okay

A core belief of The Zones of Regulation is that all the Zones are okay. We routinely experience several of the Zones across a day. It is critically important that we don't convey the message that the Green Zone is the only acceptable Zone to be in. Acknowledge, accept, and support these feelings, never make anyone feel like the Green Zone is the norm.

We hope many of you at home will find sharing some of this approach and language useful. Look out for more information and workshops for parents coming up later in the year.
