All parents and carers will receive a copy of the report with this newsletter. Alongside the report, we received a great deal of further very positive feedback from the Ofsted team. They talked at length about the 'exceptional opportunities' children at West Jesmond have and how well all groups take these up and commented that 'the world is their oyster in this school.' We were especially proud of the comments about our school curriculum and the efforts the school are making to ensure that every child makes the strongest progress in all areas. The inspectors said that, at this school, staff look at the National curriculum and seek to go above and beyond 'to enhance it for West Jesmond children.'
