### **Supporting Great Attendance at WJPS**

Thank you everyone for supporting our children to a great start to the year with very high attendance. Last year, attendance levels rose again to a very encouraging 96%+. We were all especially pleased with large reduction in the numbers of children judged to be Persistent Absentees – attendance below 90%.

You may well have seen in the news the changes to government approaches towards school attendance. This summer new guidance was provided for schools and parents, including about Fixed Penalty Notices. The guidance for parents from Newcastle Local Authority is attached with this Newsletter. **Exceptional Absence:** When reading the guidance, please note that we cannot

authorise any absence for holidays/family visits etc. The school are now only allowed to give Exceptional Absence permissions for a very limited number of cases and only usually for short periods of time. We know there are times when a child cannot come into school or is struggling to come to school. We want to work with you and offer support. If you are ever concerned about your child being unwell or struggling to come to school please speak to the school office and one of our Wellbeing Team.

We hope lots of our Reception Parents are able to attend the important meeting about supporting our children in the first steps in their reading.
