## Road Safety Reminder Again

Many parents will have noticed that the City Council are now **three quarters of the way** through their plans for changes to Tankerville Terrace.

Things have certainly improved this week as there have been no cars parked directly outside the school, blocking the road. The former parking spaces have been removed and double yellow lines will be added shortly to keep this important roadway clear. This will make the scheme much clearer and safer.



It is critical for safety that there are two moving lanes of traffic outside of the school so please do not park and block the road alongside our extended pavement and pedestrian space for COVID safety. There are further planned pedestrian pavement extensions coming on Tankerville Terrace, on the other side of the school for Year 5/6 and Reception entrances, so watch out for these coming at some point.

Please can I urge all parents to continue to be kind, considerate and patient to each other whilst these road changes are implemented by the City Council.
