



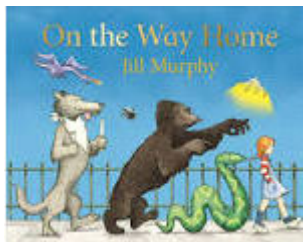

Why did she tell different stories?

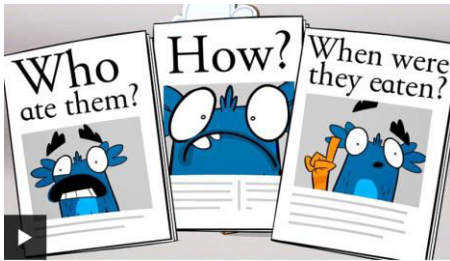
Do you think Claire has a good imagination?

Hot seat with your family to find out more about Claire - take turns at being in the hot seat and use the questions you have written to help.



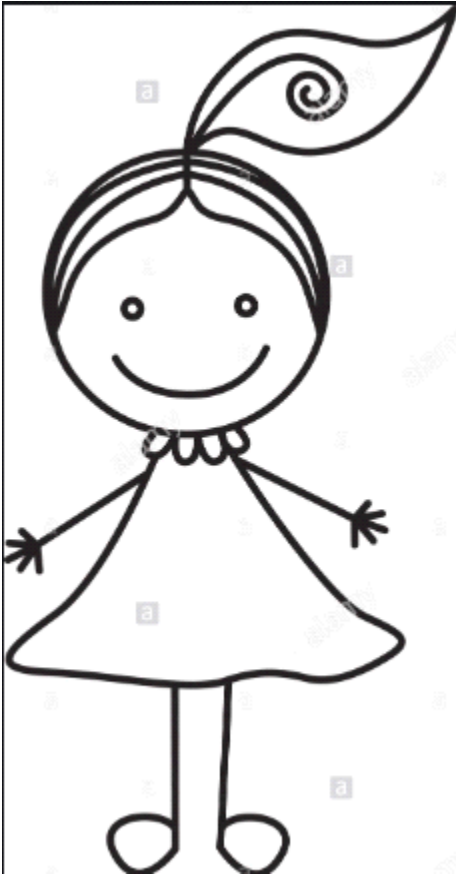


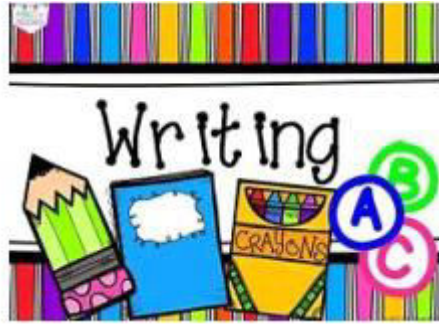
Wednesday

On the inside write adjectives to describe what kind of person Claire is.

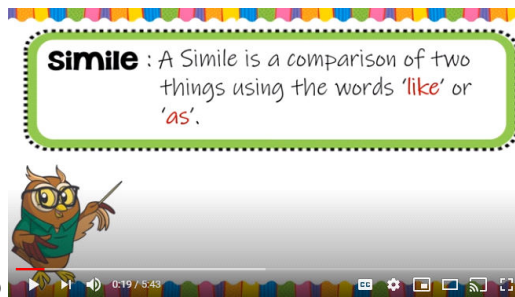
