

#### How to play...

- 1. Display a sentence to the children.
- 2. Proclaim "I am the King (or Queen) of letter land! I have awoken in an awful mood and I have decided to ban the letter <choose a letter>" **Tip: Make the game tricky by selecting a vowel: e hardest.** 
  - 3. Encourage children to identify the words which are problematic.
- 4. Children to write sentence replacing troublesome words ensuring banned letter is not included.


Additional: Children can use as many words as they like to replace troublesome words BUT the meaning of the sentence must not change. For example: "Humpty Dumpty sat NEAR a wall" would not be acceptable as NEAR is not the same as ON in meaning.



Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall.

Humpty Dumpty had a great fall.

All the king's horses and all the king's men, couldn't put Humpty together again.



I'm a little teapot short and stout,
