


THE ANGLO-SAXONS!

In 410 AD, after 400 years of strict rule, the Romans finally left Britain to protect their declining Empire from German Barbarians.



Unfortunately, the Romans had been doing a good job of protecting Britannia from tribes called the Picts up north, who now threatened to invade!



Britain also had trouble with invaders from Germany and Scandinavia - today known as the Anglo-Saxons.

The Anglo-Saxons were actually invited to Britain to help fight the raiding Picts, but when they came over, they seized land for themselves!



Three Germanic tribes settled in Britain - The Angles, the Saxons and the Jutes. Between them they created distinctive 'kingdoms', each ruled by a different king.



Some Britons DID fight back against the Anglo-Saxons. Folklore places the mythical King Arthur at the forefront of these wars, but his existence is greatly debated.



The Anglo-Saxons were renowned storytellers - even though most couldn't read or write. Their most famous story is that of the hero, Beowulf, a big inspiration for Tolkien's 'The Hobbit'!



There were also kingdoms of Sussex (South Saxons), Essex (East Saxons), and Middle Anglia (Middle Angles). These joined up with the bigger kingdoms a bit later.

Early Anglo-Saxons were Pagans, who believed in lots of gods. But the Pope was determined to reinstate Christianity. In 597AD, he sent a monk called Augustine to convert the kings. Later, a monk named Aidan converted most ordinary people.



Anglo-Saxons gave us our only official 'great' king - Alfred the Great (871-899AD)! When he wasn't burning cakes, he also translated books from Latin into English. Now everyone had the chance to read!



Alfred was also famous for tussling with the Vikings!
