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# **Primary Engineers**

# Year 6 have been very busy with engineering projects this week.

On Monday, they had fantastic Lego Engineering session with Shaun and Keeley from NERAP (North East Raising Aspirations Partnership). They spoke to us about the huge number of careers that involve STEM and explained some of the routes into these careers. We were then given the same kits and had to work collaboratively in teams to build a vehicle with at least four wheels that would be able to travel down a ramp. We tested and improved our vehicles to increase the distance that they travelled.



On Thursday, we were invited to a Primary Engineering Celebration Event. 'Our Primary Engineers did a fantastic job of building their train and the judges at the Primary Engineering Celebration event were really impressed. There was a lot of fierce competition so, unlike last year, our train didn't win the overall prize but we picked up a school award for our engineers in the making! We are so proud of them.'

This is what two of our engineers said about the event.

'Today, we went to Sunderland University CitySpace to test our trains that we have designed and built in school. Firstly, we had an interview with a mechanical engineer from Network Rail. In this interview, we got asked about how we produced our train and what improvements we could make. After that, our train was tested. When we were testing our train's ability to pull carriages, we were told that we had done the best so far, with 17 out of 20 points. Then, our train was tested in the straight line test. Unfortunately, we did not do as well in this test as our train moved at a bit of an angle. We then made the design better by adding some creative touches. Doing this, we went with a design based on the LNER Azuma design and the Newcastle train station. We hope that our train will do well in the ceremonies where we discover where we placed compared to other schools from the Tyne and Wear area.'

# **Keeping Our Children Safe Online**

Last week, we celebrated Safer Internet Day and explored what we could all do to keep ourselves safe online. We also investigated

Our school attendance at the end of half term is 96.3%. This continues to be above national averages, but we want to ensure every West Jesmond child has the highest attendance possible. Attendance for a number of children remain below 90% the figure the government judge to be persistent absentees. We know that for a small number of children in school there are reasons for lower attendance and we want to work as closely with parents and carers to help support you and your child to be able to come to school.
