Support Plans and Reviews

During the school year, we have a number of parent evenings and additional review meetings for our children with additional needs. We will be inviting you to review meetings early in the new year to talk with you about your child's progress over this term and the provision and adaptations we are offering in school. Before and during the reviews, we will be seeking your views.

However, you do not need to wait for these meetings. Please speak with your child's classteacher, to me or to any member of staff at any time about your child and any concerns that arise or questions you have. School Priorities 2024-25

One of our key whole school priorities this year is to develop our understanding of the wide range of additional needs of our children, especially SEND. All staff have had a series of training sessions looking at focussing on recognising SEND and adapting our provision, SEMH (Social, Emotional Mental Health) and Trauma awareness. This will be continuing across the year and we are very pleased to a part of an intensive training programme offered in partnership the NHS called Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS). Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) is new national programme that aims to support the education and health needs of neurodiverse children in schools through partnership approach working with local authorities and parent carer forums.

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
