This is our final newsletter of 2023 and gives us the chance to reflect on the past year at West Jesmond Primary and to thank everyone for all they have done to make this a happy and successful year for our school.

What a privilege it has been over this year to work every day with so many enthusiastic, inquisitive and energetic young people. Once again, our children have inspired and encouraged us all and the The West Jesmond Way has shone out through them. They have embraced all of our activities and we are already excitedly planning further curriculum improvements for the year ahead.

Once again results from national tests, including the Key Stage 2 SATs, are extremely strong and suggest our children are attaining well above national averages. At the end of Year 6, over 46% of West Jesmond Children reached the Greater Depth level in reading as well as an incredible 60% in Maths! However, we are especially pleased with the very high levels of progress children have demonstrated from their own individual starting points and, what matters most for all of us are the individual achievements of each child big or small. For some children stepping into school is a huge achievement, others have conquered fears at residentials, stepped on to stages, stood up in front of their classes, formed their first letters and made new friends. We celebrate the determination of every child who has found an area of learning or school life challenging and has showed resilience to keep trying, to push themselves and make progress in the area that is important to them!

Many of our children have given even more to our school over the year. We are especially grateful to our School Council, Eco Team, Digital Leaders, Sports Leaders, Team Leaders and every child who has stepped into positions of responsibility to help other children and our school. Here are our fantastic Digital Leaders who have been working hard to support Computing in school. They have been responsible for maintaining equipment, testing sites, supporting other children in class and producing digital content for use across the school.
